Overview

By 2014 everyone will be required to have electronic health records. The work required to reach this goal is expected to create a high demand in several types of health IT professionals to support this project. Itawamba Community College's intensive non-degree education program is designed to provide a pool of qualified workers with both medical and IT knowledge to ensure the electronic health record project will provide the quality and efficiency benefits needed, while maintaining privacy and security of medical information.

Workforce Roles

This program is designed to be completed in an online environment, within six months or less, and allows a student to focus on one of the following workforce roles:



- Practice workflow and information management redesign specialist
- Clinician/practitioner consultant
- Implementation support specialist
- Implementation manager
- Technical/software support staff
- Trainer

Participants may test out of classes where previous knowledge has already been obtained.

Education Requirements

- Certificate, diploma or degree in any medical area or IT background – verifiable

or

Experience Requirements

- Minimum of one year experience in health or IT field – verifiable

Other

- Completion of Work Keys test (Gold level required)
 - Test can be completed at ANY local WIN job center.
- Student affidavit

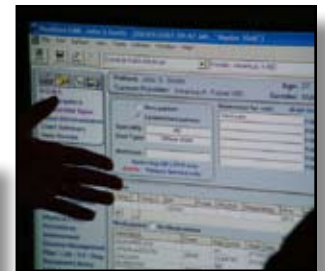
