ITAWAMBA COMMUNITY COLLEGE 2021 Community College Report Card

Itawamba Community College recently published its 2020 Report Card, which is made available by the College in compliance with House Bill No. 1071 approved during the 2010 Mississippi Legislative session. The bill created an Education Achievement Council, which was established to set educational achievement goals for institutions of higher learning and community colleges in the state and to assist in monitoring progress toward those goals.

The Community College Report Card, designed to reflect the unique mission of community colleges, includes metrics on student enrollment; completion, success, retention, progress and remediation; workforce training; high school equivalency and adult education services.

The results in the 2021 Report Card demonstrate achievement for Itawamba Community College. ICC ranked higher than the state total percentages based on figures for 2020-21 in student success measures of university parallel, Associate of Arts degrees and Associate of Applied Science degrees conferred per 100 full-time enrollment; total student success; retention; first-time, part-time and full-time progression rates and placement of Career and Health Science graduates. Workforce Training generated 65,057 contact hours of training or 21 percent of the state total with 14,168 enrollments as well as awarded 588 National Career Readiness Certificates. The adult education program awarded 106 high school equivalency certificates and enrolled 399 in adult basic services, which is nine and nine percent respectively of the statewide totals. The adult education program also had a 53.4 percent measurable skills attainment.
